Delta Park Becomes Holiday Destination

Just think of it.... An evening stroll or a wagon ride amidst trees and buildings that are all magically lit with holiday lights. If this interests you, then Lower Beverley Lake Park is the place for you this holiday season!



Launching on November 23rd, Delta Park will be open for tours on five consecutive Saturday nights. More than 75,000 Christmas lights will adorn the trees and buildings throughout the park and will highlight various displays, a candy cane lane, a gingerbread house, a nativity scene, Santa's workshop and a miniature display of Delta's heritage buildings. Mr. and Mrs. Santa Claus will be on hand to receive those special wish lists, pose for photographs and give out holiday treats.

Wagon rides to the park will only be available from the United Church on ½ hour intervals starting at 5:00 p.m.

Patrons walking through the park may do so by leaving their vehicle at the Village Boat Launch.

Delta Community Improvement Committee

Delta: a small community with a big future! Believing in this statement, a small group of concerned citizens in the community began meeting to discuss what they could do to promote the Village and help attract businesses to Delta.

Following a series of meetings, a new group was formed under the name of the Delta Community Improvement Committee (DCIC). With an Executive Committee and Board of Directors, the goal of this group is to work cooperatively with the Township of Rideau Lakes and the surrounding community to preserve Delta's past while charting its future.

The Village of Delta has a vibrant past. It can be said that this fascinating community was originally settled in 1794 by Elder Abel Stevens. Arriving from Vermont, he first explored the land before bringing a number of people to the area-many of them his own relatives. Naturally enough, this little settlement quickly became known as Stevenstown. For the next two decades, Stevenstown continued to grow and prosper and then, in 1815, William Jones erected a stone grist mill in the centre of the community. For the next 11 years, the village would be called Stone Mills until it was renamed Beverly in honour of Upper Canada Chief Justice John Beverley Robinson. 30 years later, the name was once again changed to Delta.

Between 1850 and the early 1900's, Delta boasted of more than twenty different businesses making it a prominent community with Leeds County as it managed to sustain the needs of the people.

Today, the Village attracts thousands of visitors to Lower Beverley Lake Township Park along with many other residents who consider Delta their summer home along the shores of the beautiful Beverley Lakes. The Old Stone Mill (NHS) has been restored to a working mill and, following renovations, the Old Town Hall hosts many activities and is the site of the Stone Mill Café.

The community also boasts of many long standing annual events including the Maple Syrup Festival, the Delta Fair, the Thanksgiving Festival, and Celebrating the Season. Delta has an outdoor rink and recreation centre, a ball park, village parks with gazebos, two churches, a grocery store, a liquor store, a library, a fire department and a post office. Throughout the village, there are several heritage buildings, each with its own unique architecture.

Most recently, the Township of Rideau Lakes has committed to create a *Community Improvement Plan for Delta*. The initial part of the plan is a Visioning Workshop which will be held on **Wednesday, November 20th from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Old Town Hall in Delta**. All residents of Delta and the surrounding area are encouraged to participate.

Moving forward together! By coming together, sharing ideas, exploring new ways, remembering the past, valuing our neighbours, creating opportunities, and supporting each other, Delta will have a brighter future.

DELTA COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT PLAN (CIP) IN THE WORKS

The Township of Rideau Lakes Development Services Department is currently developing a Community Improvement Plan (CIP) for the Village of Delta and is looking for public input.

What is a CIP?

A CIP is a tool that can be used by the Township to direct and encourage growth and redevelopment through a partnership with the community and its businesses. A CIP can include specific support programs to support community-driven redevelopment which generally offset a portion of the costs related to building and business improvements.

Why a CIP for Delta and why now?

A Community Improvement Plan is being developed which outlines a vision for Delta's future as an important destination within the Township. Supporting community visioning and redevelopment through CIPs is a goal within the current Official Plan.

How can I participate and help shape my community's plan?

The Township's Planning Advisory Committee, in conjunction with staff, would like to begin developing a draft CIP. The Committee is seeking community input on the plan from residents, business owners and interested parties. Throughout this process there will be many ways to become involved. The first step in the process is a Visioning Workshop. **Township staff will be hosting the event Wednesday, November 20, 2013 from 6:00 to 8:00 pm at the Old Town Hall in Delta (8 Lower Beverley Park Road).** The event will allow community members an opportunity to provide input that will help to create the foundation for the Delta CIP. Some of the discussion topics at the workshop will include identifying potential boundaries for the CIP, identifying important community features, nodes, landmarks and viewsapes, as well as generating the overall vision for Delta's future.

We look forward to your input and involvement to ensure the success of this planning effort.
