## THANK YOU for supporting the Delta Maple Syrup Festival



The Board of Directors of the Delta Agricultural Society would like to extend their sincere appreciation to all of the volunteers, sponsors, vendors, attendees and partner organizations that helped make the 48<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebrations most successful and memorable for all!

During the festival, 1850 patrons enjoyed 26 boxes of sausages (143kg=315lbs.), 22 bags of pancake mix (220kg=485lbs.), 7 bottles of juice mix, 2 cases of coffee and 400 lbs. /140 litres of maple syrup.

## GOOD FOOD BOX PROGRAM

While it is not always easy to eat the recommended amount of daily fruit and vegetables, residents may seek assistance from the Good Food Box program in attaining such a goal. The Good Food Box Program, which has been operating through the Country Roads Community Health Centre since 2004, provides an opportunity to buy fresh produce at wholesale prices once a month.



The program is available to all area residents with no obligation to re-order each month. Enrollment in the program is very easy; just visit the Delta Public Library during regular hours to obtain an order form, prepay and place your order. Library hours include every Tuesday from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00p.m., Wednesday from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., Thursday from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. and Saturday from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Orders must be placed by the 7<sup>th</sup> of each month with pick up being at 10:30 a.m. on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of each month at the United Church.

The contents of the order vary from month to month depending upon what is in season. Options available include a \$5 fruit bag, a \$5 vegetable bag, a \$10 combination box, or a large \$15 combination box. Pamphlets explaining the selections are available at the library.



The Good Food Box Program supports the local farmers when possible. It is a non-profit, community based organization which is operated by volunteers and supported by a Health Promoter and Registered Dietician. For information related to the Delta Site, please contact Claire at 613-928-2761.

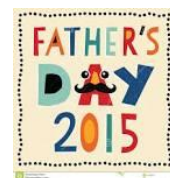
