“A” SECTION UPGRADES

The conversion of eight non-serviced sites in the A-Section to sites with both 30 amp and water services have now been completed. Ian Johnson, Director with the Valley Heartland Economic Development Corporation, visited the park in early July to present Park Coordinator William Morris with a \$7,500 cheque in support of this project. This upgrade will enhance our capability to host the larger RV camping units.





Main Service Centre Upgrades

Thanks to a joint Federal and Provincial infrastructure funding initiative, numerous facility upgrades will be made to the Main Service Centre during the fall of 2009. The 40 year old building will be getting new interior stalls, doors, toilets, sinks and lights. Exterior landscaping will also be carried out to support the construction of new access sidewalks, ramps and decks.

Both the Federal and Provincial Government each contributed \$12,000 with the remainder of the \$40,000 project being subsidized by the Park Management Board. Once completed, the facility will be fully accessible for our patrons with physical disabilities.

Notice to All Seasonal Campers

In August of 2008, the Management Board reviewed the policy statement which relates to the care and maintenance of seasonal sites. Specific reference was made to the section related to the condition of waste barrels.

Following the review, the following changes were made to the policy statement for subsequent implementation prior to the 2009 camping season:

- The site holder is responsible for the ongoing maintenance of the sewage line which leads from the trailer to the waste barrel.
 - **Option One:** The line shall be made of 3” diameter ABS or PVC piping and shall be securely fastened to the tank.
 - **Option Two:** All existing flex-hoses can either be changed to abs piping or shall be contained within a 3” to 4” ABS or PVC diameter pipe.
 - **Option Three:** In the event the existing flex hose is contained within an eve trough structure or something similar to an eve trough, the hose must be covered on all four sides.

The new requirements were contained within the 2009 renewal packages which were provided to all campers in September of 2008. An additional reminder was printed in the June issue of the Park Post newsletter.

While some seasonal campers have complied with the request to upgrade, there are still some sites which remain non-compliant.

Park staff is willing to assist campers with this upgrade. Should you be interested, staff is willing to complete the upgrade for you for a minimal cost of \$20.00 which includes time, material and installation. Please contact the Gate House should you wish to accept this offer. Payment is due upon registration.

We are requesting that all sites be upgraded by August 6th. After that time, we will no longer be able to pump the trailer’s blue tank.

There has also been some concern amongst campers regarding the “pulling of trailer pins” during the pumping process as well. Staff has been instructed to pull all pins but it will be the responsibility of the site holder to push the pins back into the trailer. Once pulled, there will no longer be any doubt as to the action of staff.

Any questions specifically related to site layout and the upgrading of tank piping should be directed to Maintenance Lead Hand Brian Abrams.
