Thanks to a partnership between Hydro One, our Seasonal Campers' Recreation Committee and the Park Management Board, a new Exploration Climber will soon be added to our playground area. With a total foot print size of 34' x 42', this primary climber will provide hours of enjoyment for the thousands of children who visit our park throughout the season. June 20th has been set as an installation date for the climber which is valued at \$23,500
