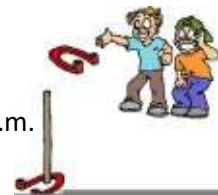

The Management Board would like to extend their sincere appreciation to Al Moorhouse for all his efforts and numerous contributions during the past eight years as the Campers' Liaison.

In preparation for the upcoming term of Council, applications for the position of Special Advisor to the Park Management Board as the Seasonal Camper Liaison will be accepted at the Park Office by mail, email or fax until October 31st at 4:00 p.m.

Liaison for the Seasonal Campers refers to an individual, who is currently a seasonal camper that is in good standing within the park and has expressed a written willingness and interest to serve as a Special Advisor to the Board with non-voting rights.

The main responsibility of the Advisor is to provide input to discussions which directly impact camping related issues that are under consideration by the Board. This is not a supervisory position. The Advisor is required to attend the six regular meetings of the Management Board.

The Advisor is required to provide a written report, on the activities of the Seasonal Campers, to the Park Manager one week prior to each meeting for inclusion in the meeting agenda package. The Advisor is also required to prepare a message for each Park Post Newsletter.

While not required, preference will be given to those campers who are actively involved with or are willing to support functions sponsored by the Seasonal Campers' Recreation Sub-Committee.

The term of office shall be for two years and shall span a period from January 2023 to December 2024.

UPDATE ON PARK PROJECTS

It certainly has been a busy season for the staff at Lower Beverley Lake Park. Not only have staff served the needs of the growing number of transient campers but they have also been busy maintaining the park and completing several upgrades.

Within the last month, the electrical and water services have been installed to the former non-serviced field sites which now comprise the new M-Section. By the time you read this edition of the Post, the electrical inspection will have been completed and we are hopeful that the power line will have been energized. A new 10' x 16' Bunkie will be placed in this section to accommodate new water treatment equipment for an additional well which will serve the J, K, M and Graveside sites.

Park staff have also been busy painting/staining various buildings, upgrading parking areas and walkways, and yes, even cutting additional trees. These projects will continue after the Labour Day weekend along with the transplanting of new trees within the park by Manotick Tree Movers. It is hopeful that the Cataraqui Region Conservation Authority will allow the entrance hill accessibility project at the beach to proceed in the fall.
