After being closed to the public during the past two years, visitors are once again welcomed through the doors of the Old Stone Mill. Through the efforts of the Society's dedicated volunteers and summer students, the Old Stone Mill has been open seven days a week.

Miller Chris Wooding has been offering grinding demonstrations throughout the summer. Sales of his freshly ground red fife flour have been excellent.

The Old Stone Mill Cookbook is being reprinted with additional copies soon becoming available.

During the two years of COVID shut down, much of the interpretive signage was updated and rearranged along with the addition of some new exhibits including "The Hopper Boy" which was another important piece of the milling operation. This third-floor exhibit has been well received by many visitors.

The Old Stone Mill will close after Labour Day weekend, but it will be open during the Harvest Festival on September 24<sup>th</sup>.

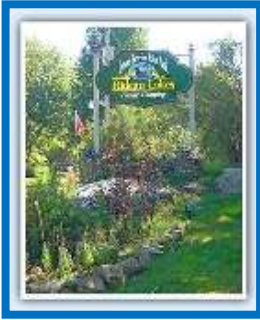
It has been a long time coming but the blacksmith shop project is nearing completion. Two new shiny forge stacks, complete with the anvils on top, have been installed on the shop roof to support the two forges inside.

During the Harvest Festival, a "Hammer In" event will be held to officially open the blacksmith shop that will showcase local tools of the trade and "The Lyndhurst Bear". New interpretive signage will explain the importance of the blacksmithing trade in the building of the Old Stone Mill and the community of Delta over 200 years ago. Invitations are extended to all Blacksmiths to come for 10:00 a.m. to celebrate this festive occasion. Bring your favourite hammers, willingness to demonstrate, things to forge, things to brag about, things to learn from, things to eat and drink, cameras, curiosity, questions, and answers.

Numerous events have been held at The Old Town Hall this summer including children's painting classes, breakfast meals for the Old Bastards' Motorcycle Club; the film screening of three heritage documentary films, a Platinum Jubilee Tea Party, and a Festival of Small Halls Concert.

Other upcoming events include another Festival of Small Halls Concert on October 14<sup>th</sup> and a "Christmas Market" at the end of November.

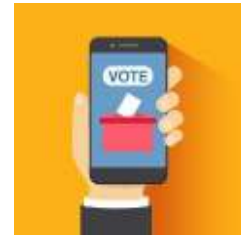
Vote-By-Mail and traditional voting will not be utilized.

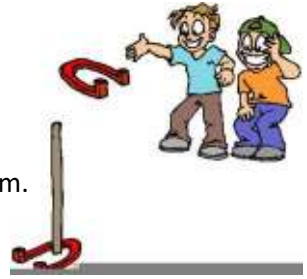

It is hard to believe but the summer of 2022 is drawing to a close. I hope that everyone has had a wonderful summer and that you were able to enjoy many of the attractions in our area.

Lower Beverley Lake Park Road, Plum Hollow Road, Hartsgravel Road by Willows Agri-Services, and Summers Road have now been paved.

Norwood Contracting is in the process of ordering the supplies so that they can complete the Waterfront Park this fall. This project started in 2018 as a vision and thanks to the many community donations, grant funding, fund raising, and support from the Township of Rideau Lakes, it will be a great addition to our community.

A temporary fire station for the Portland area will be located at the Portland Transfer Station.

Council approved funding to cover the disconnection of the hydro and the removal of the two damaged poles at the Lakersfield ball diamond so it can now be safely used. Perhaps as we look to the future, we can find funding through grants and fund-raising efforts to have new poles with LED lighting installed.

The "Meet Your Neighbour" in Delta was postponed due to possible storms, that didn't happen, but rescheduling it is still in the plans.

On July 15<sup>th</sup>, the Municipal Heritage Advisory Committee presented a film screening festival at the Old Town Hall at which 65 people enjoyed the three historical documentaries.
