Wartime friends reunited at Delta Maple Festival 1997

MEMORY LANE

DELTA — Leonard Birchall was looking forward to his first trip to the maple festival here this year — but it wasn't only for pancakes drowned in maple syrup.

Birchall, a retired air force commander now living in Kingston, had planned to attend the 17th annual event and was looking to see what the festival had to offer. What he saw listed in the promotional material shocked and surprised him and he knew he'd have to make the trip for old time's sake:

Listed among the fair organizers was the name Lloyd Sawyer, a long-time Delta resident who, along with his wife, has worked with the festival for several years. Sawyer, a maintenance man in the air force during World War II, had served with Birchall in 1942.

"I wrote to the festival and got Lloyd's name on the list so I intended to look him up," said Birchall, who served two weeks with Sawyer before being shot down over the Indian Ocean. After Birchall was taken as a prisoner of war, he never saw (Sawyer) again — until Satur"I knew he was shot down but we didn't know he had been taken as a prisoner of war until about two years later," Sawyer said of Birchall's fateful flight. "I hadn't seen or heard from him until he called me a few days ago and we set up this meeting."

More than 2,500 people turned out to the two-day event to get a taste of the fresh pancakes and maple syrup made locally, said Alice Leeson, one of the fair organizers. The event usually attracts between 6,000 and 10,000 people annually from as far away as Kingston, Ottawa and Cornwall but Leeson said attendance has been dropping steadily during the past few years.

"The attendance wasn't too bad this year, though" said Leeson, adding Sunday's rain contributed to the small crowds. She said it's possible the fair could be cut back to one day if the attendance continues to fall.

The fair used to be a three-day event but was cut back two years ago to two days, said Leeson. The festival was held from Friday to Sunday so that school children in the area could tour the plant and get their fill of griddle cakes while on a school "But once the kids see it once, they aren't really that interested in it the next year," said Leeson.

The money raised during the festival — about \$2,670 last year — goes to support local groups such as the volunteer fire department, the athletic association, the senior citizens group, the Lions club and the local Legion. Leeson said the event usually generates about \$8,500 in revenue but more than twothirds of that (about \$6,000 to \$7,000) is spent on such things as milk, eggs and flour for the pancakes as well as promotion for the event.

There were only two scheduled trips to the sugar bushes this year for anybody interested in seeing how maple syrup is made. The United Maple Products building was open to visitors during the weekend for those who wanted to see how the sticky stuff was manufactured and bottled for retail sale.

An added attraction to this year's event was the Queen's University Golden Gaels Band. The band, complete with baton twirlers, majorettes and a gymnastics team, entertained a crowd of about 75 people Saturday who were waiting outside the town hall for their turn at the

WE ARE HIRING – The Delta Mill Society has several summer positions available for mill interpreters. These are job openings for university or high school students interested in gaining experience at a significant National Historic Site of Canada. The job involves greeting visitors to the mill and showcasing the mill and the many stories it represents. Full training and support are provided. Depending on the grant funding program, candidates must either be returning to school or be between the ages of 15 to 30 and a Canadian citizen who is eligible and willing to register with a government grant program. We will be open during Delta's Maple Syrup Festival featuring milling, blacksmithing and the Ginormous Used Book Sale. The book sale, jointly sponsored by the Delta Mill Society and the Rideau Lakes Library, will be held in the Old Town Hall with the books available by donation. Proceeds from the book sale are split between the DMS and the RLL.

The newly renovated Blacksmith Shop will feature a hammer-in on Saturday, April 15th, with blacksmiths hammering away for the enjoyment of the public. The Old Stone Mill will be open for tours and the millstones will start grinding heritage red fife wheat into flour at 1:00 p.m.

Volunteers continue to be very busy behind the scenes as they are working to complete the "new" blacksmith shop displays and signage. One such sign will be a large new Blacksmith Shop sign on the front of the building which we hope to have in place this spring. We are also working with local blacksmiths to have the shop open as a Living Museum on Saturdays during the summer and we are looking into hosting blacksmith training courses. We'll have details posted to our website as they become available.

Our Collections Project will be entering its fourth year in 2023. This is a large project to properly document, arrange and store our large collection of archives and artefacts. Some of these artefacts are on display, but many more (over 1,000) are held in our collection spaces. The proper documentation of these, to museum standards, is a long and exacting process.

The Old Town Hall will again be the home to several musical events, we already have two scheduled (May and June) with several more in the works. See the events page on our website for details.

We always welcome new volunteers. If you are interested in helping out in any way, please contact us. We are in particular need of those who would like to become volunteer mill interpreters. While we use students during the summer, there is a need for volunteers in the off season as well as mentors and student supervisors during the main season. This activity is particularly suited to those with an interest in history and communicating that history to the visiting public. The mill has a very rich history and we have people and written resources available to assist with training.


