

Celebrating 50 Years Rídeau Lakes Cycle Tour on June 10th and 11th, 2023

Delta is along the route for many of the cyclists participating in the Ottawa Bicycle Club's Rideau Lakes Cycle Tour on June 10th and 11th. Approximately 600 cyclists will be travelling through Delta on both Saturday and Sunday with many stopping at the former Anglican Church for refreshments provided by The Old Stone Mill/Delta Mill Society, and the St. Paul's Anglican Community Centre (SPACC) as a combined fund-raiser.

In 1972, the Ottawa Bicycle Club organized its first two-day ride from Ottawa to Kingston and back. Over the years, the tour route has grown and to add a start/finish in Perth. This tour passes through the picturesque countryside of Rideau Lakes Township. The tour attracts cyclists from various locations throughout North America for an unforgettable cycling experience. In previous years, over 1800 cyclists participated in this event most of whom were accommodated at Queen's University in Kingston.

At St. Paul's Anglican Church, the cyclists will be able to refill their water bottles. Portable toilets will be available for participant usage. The Ontario Provincial Police will be providing officers for traffic management throughout the event.


Tickets for the event will be available at the door at 36 King St. Delta. Admission for one night is \$25, and a pass for both nights is \$40.

ROBERTSON CEMETERY



Delta's Robertson Cemetery is located near the entrance to Lower Beverley Lake Park on land that was donated by the Robertson family in the early 1800's and the Lower Beverley Lake Park in the late 1990's. The entrance of the cemetery, which is adorned with a masonry gate that was built by Lloyd Sawyer in 1994, serves as a foundation for the wrought iron sign that reads "Robertson Cemetery 1811".

This interdenominational cemetery, which is registered with the Township of Rideau Lakes and the Bereavement Authority of Ontario, has 200 plots remaining to be sold at a very reasonable price. The cemetery is managed by a volunteer Board of Directors which was established in 1989 and meets three times a year. The Board also organizes the annual memorial service which will be held on June 4th at 2:00 p.m. at the Cemetery, 115 Lower Beverley Lake Park Road, Delta. In the event of inclement weather, the service will be held in the Baptist Church.

The Old Stone Mill will open for the season on Saturday, May 20th with a milling demonstration scheduled for 1:00 p.m. that day. The Blacksmith Shop will also be open that day with blacksmiths hammering away. The complete schedule of milling and blacksmithing demonstrations is available on the events page of the Society's website at http://www.deltamill.org/events.html

The newly renovated Blacksmith Shop has been a huge success. Big thanks to Art Shaw, DMS director and our Blacksmithing Co-ordinator, for managing that large renovation project. More work still needs to be completed including rebranding the building as the 'Blacksmith Shop' with a new 16-foot-long sign that was expertly painted by volunteer Darlene Campbell. Plans are in place to have the sign installed on the building prior to May 20th.

The "new" shop opened for the first time during the Harvest Festival in September of 2022 followed by another showcase during last month's Maple Syrup Festival when several blacksmiths hammered away and showcased the heritage art of blacksmithing to the visiting public. 

Folks asked about power on replacement hydro poles and the following information was provided by Ontario Hydro "Unfortunately, Hydro One does not allow for unmetered variable connections (like an outlet) on their infrastructure anymore. They only permit electrical fixtures with a defined power draw, light for a light standard, to be unmetered since its power draw can be reliably estimated and costed. They explained that therefore, as infrastructure is replaced (like replacing a pole) they do not put back what they no longer permit.'

I have also been asked about the status of the former Beverley Elementary School property on Foundry Street and have been informed that after environmental testing, a record of site condition (RSC) is completed to determine the environmental condition of the property. We are still waiting for more information from the Ministry.

RECORDER AND TIMES / July 29th, 1989 DELTA ROCKED BY UNITED MAPLE CLOSURE

DELTA — The closing of this village's only industry is a major blow to an already suffering economy, the reeve of the township and members of the local business community said Wednesday.

"United Maple Products has been the backbone of the community ever since the Hydro office closed about 20 years ago and wiped out a lot of things with it." said Bastard and South Burgess Reeve Arch Ostrom Wednesday.

"United Maple was the only industry left to stabilize things: the company employed about 40 people about that time. The economy got better, although it never was quite the same. But where are all the people going to go now? I know one man who is 38 or 39 years old and has worked there since he was 16. What is going to happen to him and the others like him?"

Members of the local business community stunned by the announcement of the United Maple closure echoed the views of Ostrom.

"I never saw it coming. Things used to be pretty good in the days with the hydro office and the railroad here. Now there's nothing left," said Ron Morris of Morris and Son Grocery in Delta.

Morris and Ostrom both said

the closing of the plant, which employed 18 people and packaged and shipped maple syrup and byproducts, would adversely affect local businesses.

"You can't take 18 to 20 paychecks out of a community as small as Delta and not have it hurt business. It's going to hurt a lot," said Morris.

"It's not just the paychecks of the people that work there we're going to lose," said Ostrom. "The truckers who come in to pick up a load at the plant and buy gas at the local station or grab a bite to eat for lunch at the local snack bar won't be coming around any more. Neither will the salespeople."

Ostrom said he has suspected the United Maple would close ever since it was purchased by the United States food giant Borden Inc. from the John Labatt company earlier this year. But he and local residents were confused by the companies apparent success in the recent months and the increase in work hours and pay enjoyed by the employees.

But operations manager Bob Bayles said Wednesday success was not an issue in the closure.

"We were enjoying a good business, the closure is due to different circumstances."

The circumstances were outlined in a press release issued by Borden's head office in New York City which stated the main reasons were the high costs to bring the 50year-old plant up to acceptable production standards.

Ostrom didn't buy that reason. He blamed the closure on free trade.

"I say it's free trade and I always will believe it's free trade. They're moving some of the processing operations to their plant at Essex Junction in Vermont. Why? Because the wages are cheaper there. Why should they pay more for the same work?"

Ostrom said he doesn't believe the plant is below standards.

"The bottling part is only about 10 to 11 years old and the office is in good shape. Sure that front part of the plant isn't in terrific shape, I'll give them that; but it's not even being used, hasn't been used for anything in years except for storage. Besides, they've been doing upgrading work on the plant since they bought it."

But Bayles said the work that has been done has only been "housekeeping type" work.

"There are a lot of major repairs which have to be considered before everything is up
