PROPANE TANK EXCHANGE PROGRAM



Park staff are pleased to offer a propane tank exchange. Empty 20-pound tanks may be exchanged for full tanks provided that the tank issuance date is not prior to 2015. Tanks with propane may also be purchased from staff at the Gate House.

A COUPLE OF REMINDERS......

Boat / Utility Trailer Storage

There are several boat and utility trailers that have been left in the Visitor's Parking area across the road from the Canteen. Seasonal Campers are reminded that the intent of this area is for visitor parking and not storage for trailers throughout the summer. Please remove your trailers prior to the July 1st holiday weekend. There is unsupervised space for the trailers to be stored /chained to the fence near the woodlot, at the public boat launch or on your own site.

Trailer Sales

■ We have now exhausted the list of people on our seasonal waiting list for this year who wish to purchase a trailer on an existing site. Moving forward, any Seasonal Camper who wishes to sell their trailer may do so, but the site does not go with the trailer. If you sell your trailer, the trailer is to be removed from the park and you will receive a refund for the balance of the camping season.

Emergency Services

If you dial 911, our civic address is 146 Lower Beverley Lake Park Road, Delta.

After you call for assistance, you need to notify the Gate House so that staff can clear the entrance gates of campers registering with their trailers.

Large Household Items

As of late, there have been several pieces of larger articles of furniture appearing at the curb or in the maintenance storage area that are not associated with camping. Seasonal Campers are reminded that while staff continue to work to keep the park clean, campers should not be bringing articles from home to dispose of in the park. Thank you.

Postal Services

Campers are reminded that they need to go to the Delta Post Office and establish a means of receiving mail if they are using the park's civic address for mail purposes. Park Staff cannot accept a camper's personal mail that has been addressed to the park at Box 130, Delta. Any such mail will be returned to the sender.

Golf Carts

The use of golf carts within the park is permitted for accessibility purposes only. Please remember that the cart is not to be used by other members of the family/visitors to the site or children who do not have accessibility issues. Campers should also be mindful that the carts need to be insured and as such, listed on your policy.

2024 SEASONAL RENEWAL PACKAGES

Seasonal campsite renewal packages will be available on August 1st from Reception Staff at the Gate House with a return date of September 1st.



CHILDREN'S FISHING DEBY

BLACKSMITHING DEMONSTRATION July 15th


