### STAMP MOSAIC DISPLAY at DELTA POST OFFICE

A beautiful mosaic of colourful stamps is now on display at the Delta Post Office. Crafted by former Delta resident 102-year-old Beth Robinson, the mosaic was created during the COVID-19 Pandemic to pass the time.

Beth studied occupational therapy at the University of Toronto, and during



World War II she was employed at the Military Hospital in Ste. Anne de Bellevue, close to Montreal where she worked with both the physically and emotionally injured men and women. After her marriage, and with her children in school, she returned to occupational therapy and later studied to become an art therapist before teaching at the Ontario College of Art, and Concordia University.

Beth is an exceptional woman of many skills, talents, and passions. She is involved in introducing a teaching film on Post Traumatic Stress Disorder to audiences. Her latest achievement is a published wartime memoir, "Please Write" and currently is writing short stories for Peace Quest Kingston. She is still involved with the modern dance world in Toronto and Guelph, and even dances with the Irish! Beth was presented with the Queen Elizabeth Diamond Jubilee medal in 2012 and Governor General's Caring Canadian award in 2014.



Beth is one of the original four trustees that received the deed for the Old Stone Mill from Hastings Steele in 1963 and set it on its course to become the museum it is today. She is the daughter of a well-known, Delta born resident, Dr. Lorne Pierce who attended several universities including Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario, Victoria College at the University of Toronto and the Wesleyan Theological College in Montreal. Pierce was both a United and a Methodist Church minister. In 1920, he was appointed as literary advisor to the Ryerson Press and from 1922 to 1960, he was the editor. During his forty years as editor, he oversaw the

publishing and promotion of Canadian literature. A committed nationalist, he viewed literature as an important aspect of Canada's cultural development in the mid-twentieth century, Pierce lent his name to the Lorne Pierce Medal, established in 1926 to honour writers, critics, and educators for their outstanding contributions to the development of Canadian literature and culture.

### **Beverley Elementary School Property**

The Upper Canada District School Board advised in December 2022 that the insurance company is still working toward getting their Record of Site Condition filed with the Ministry of Environment. Continued assessment work is a part of that process. This is the first step for the Board in declaring the property surplus before it can be sold. No further updates are available at that time.

### **Maple Syrup Factory**

Council has commissioned an environmental assessment to be conducted on the property. Information will be provided as it becomes available.

### **Spring Flooding**

Following a spring where the village was once again at risk of flooding due to the deteriorating berm behind the DARS property, Council directed that the Ministry be engaged again with action being sought on a long-term and sustainable solution. The Ministry advised they will review the matter once again but made no commitment to any specific course of action.

### **Delta's New Waterfront Park**

The Waterfront Park is almost complete. Planting is scheduled to happen in mid-June. We are waiting for Hydro One to schedule the hydro activation. Norwood Construction is doing the sidewalk in front of the park along King Street at a time that is yet to be confirmed. They will likely need to make some minor repairs to some of the concrete in the park at the same time as they do the sidewalk work.
