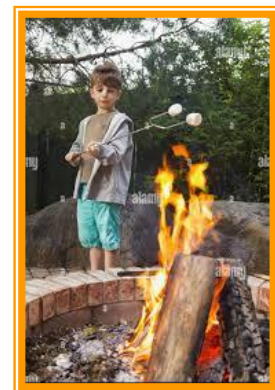

## Recycling in the Park



As many of you are aware, changes to the recycling programs across the province are being implemented since the Ontario government passed regulations that shift the financial and operational responsibility for recycling programs to the producers of recyclable materials.

Recycling programs within the park will remain unchanged as outlined in the Spring Park Post. Collection will be provided every Sunday. Seasonal campers must sort, bag and place their recycling next to the garbage barrels before noon on Sunday. Campers are welcome to personally deliver their recycling to the bins in the Maintenance Yard.

We are no longer able to pick up your large items such as televisions, mattresses, barbeques, trailer furniture, decks etc. In these cases, it is **“carry in / carry out”**. Contact Reception Staff at the Gate House should have any exceptional circumstances.

Regular household waste in clear bags will still be available by placing your garbage in the black and white checkered cans.

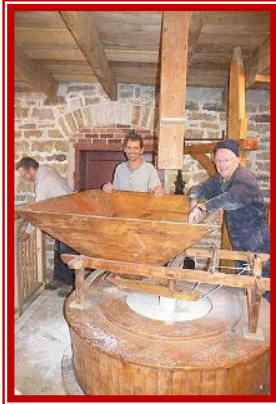

June 7<sup>th</sup>, 21<sup>st</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>

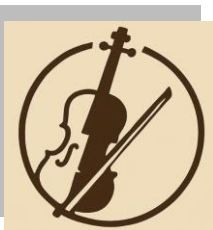

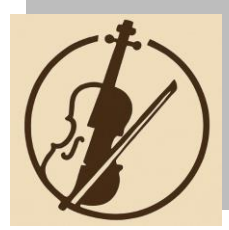


## Fiddlers' Service at the United Church

## Robertson Cemetery



Delta's Robertson Cemetery is located near the entrance to Lower Beverley Lake Park on land that was donated by the Robertson family in the early 1800's and Lower Beverley Lake Park in the late 1990's. The entrance of the cemetery, which is adorned with a masonry gate that was built by Lloyd Sawyer in 1994, serves as a foundation for the wrought iron sign that reads "Robertson Cemetery 1811".

This interdenominational cemetery, which is registered with the Township of Rideau Lakes and the Bereavement Authority of Ontario, has 200 plots remaining to be sold at a very reasonable price. The cemetery is managed by a volunteer Board of Directors which was established in 1989 and meets three times a year. The Board also organizes the **Annual Memorial Service** which will be held on **June 8<sup>th</sup> at 2:00 p.m.**

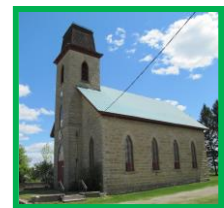
## Farmer's Breakfast

## Dangers Of Carbon Monoxide Poisoning While Camping

Camping, a favorite family past time and the vacation of choice for people of all ages, has its share of dangers. Aside from hazardous weather conditions and at times treacherous surrounding terrain, fuel-powered camping equipment can be potentially dangerous for your health. Carbon monoxide poisoning can occur and can be fatal.

### What Is Carbon Monoxide Poisoning?

Carbon monoxide (CO) is emitted when fuel, such as natural gas or propane, is burned. It is odorless and colorless, virtually impossible to detect. When an excess of CO is inhaled, a person can suffer from carbon monoxide poisoning, a predicament that can quickly lead to death.

Camping usually involves a tent, camper or RV. When combustibles are used within these enclosed quarters without proper ventilation people in proximity are at high risk of carbon monoxide poisoning. Lanterns, space heaters, portable grills, gas burning appliances, and other fuel-powered equipment should only be lit and burnt outside.

### Symptoms of Carbon Monoxide Poisoning

Because the symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning resemble those of the common cold or flu, they are often initially ignored. Immediate attention should be paid to someone who has been exposed to CO emission and displays the following signs:

- Headaches
- Nausea and/or vomiting
- Dizziness
- General confusion
- Weakness or excessive sleepiness

### Treatment

Quickly turn off the appliance and open doors and windows to ventilate the area thoroughly. Call 911 to transport the victim immediately to a clinic or hospital if you suspect that any of the above-mentioned symptoms might be due to a CO exposure.

### Who Is at Risk?

Carbon monoxide does not affect all people in the same way. Some age groups are more vulnerable, and individuals with certain conditions can be at higher risk than others.

Children, the elderly, pregnant women, smokers and those with lung problems, individuals suffering from anemia and other circulatory problems are at high risk when exposed to CO.

### How to Avoid or Reduce the Risk

Adequate ventilation in your tent, camper, RV, and any other enclosed areas is important. When using gas burning units such as the portable stove in your RV, or gas lanterns in your tent, a conscious effort should be made to keep the door or windows open.

Camping in cooler weather is especially dangerous for carbon monoxide poisoning because there is a frequent need for heating units and a strong tendency to stay inside due to the weather.

Enjoy your camping trip by being aware of the dangers of carbon monoxide poisoning. Limit the risk to ensure that your family and friends are safe; install a CO detector.
