The **Robertson Cemetery** has been a vital part of the Delta community for over 200 years, serving as a place of remembrance, heritage, and connection. As an *active cemetery*, it is governed by a dedicated volunteer Board of Directors whose mission is to manage the cemetery's operations, foster community involvement and pride, and implement improvements that reflect the evolving needs of the people it serves. The Board also emphasizes the importance of preserving the natural environment surrounding the cemetery which is adjacent to Lower Beverley Lake Park.

For the past 30 years, continuous efforts have been made to maintain and enhance the cemetery grounds. Looking ahead, the Board has several forward-thinking goals, including fundraising for a columbarium and scattering grounds to provide more diverse burial options for today's community. Plans also include creating a website, establishing a social media presence, and developing electronic mapping tools to preserve the cemetery's rich history and honour those interred.

Ongoing tasks such as cleaning older headstones and repairing fences are part of the maintenance efforts. Additionally, the Board is focused on improving the documentation and record-keeping of burial sites and fostering a collaborative network with other cemeteries within the municipality. Reaching these goals will take a diverse mix of skills, teamwork, and community support. The volunteer Board is a dedicated and passionate group, but they know that extra hands can help move things forward more quickly and effectively. Do you have an interest or skills that could contribute? Do you have some spare time you'd be willing to share in support of the Cemetery? Volunteers of all experience levels are welcome, and many tasks can even be done from the comfort of your own home. If any of this sounds like a good fit for you, we'd love to hear from you!

The annual Robertson Cemetery Memorial Service will take place at 2:00 p.m. on Sunday, June 8th, 2025, at the cemetery grounds, 146 Lower Beverley Lake Park Road, Delta. As the 2025 tourism season begins, volunteers will be carrying fond memories of Anna Greenhorn with them as they work at the Old Stone Mill. Anna, who passed on April 3rd at the age of 95 years, was a volunteer with the Delta Mill Society for the past 52 years. With an incredibly positive attitude towards life, she was a driving force of the Delta Mill Society. Anna would often end her email messages with “onward and upward” as she believed that there was no challenge that could not be overcome. The Society has faced numerous problems over the years, and it has overcome them all – much due in-part to that positive can-do attitude.

Anna’s involvement with the Delta Mill Society began when she met Myrta Saunders who invited her to become a volunteer. In Anna’s own words, “Initially I thought I would be baking cookies or something alike but by the second meeting I was already appointed as the Treasurer.” Clearly the board recognized Anna’s many abilities – there was no job that she couldn’t tackle and do well. After serving as Treasurer, she became the long serving Secretary. Board meetings, which were often held at her house in Phillippsville, were always fun to attend.

Anna was a natural communicator and loved telling the stories of the mill. She became the lead oral interpreter of the Society which included ensuring that the summer students properly presented the mill to the visiting public. During an early visit to the mill, Anna fell in love with the five-sided ridge pole, handmade from a single piece of pine that is of a Dutch architectural design. There are also English wind braces and German queen beams and Anna wove this information into a story of the architecture from these three countries working together in harmony. To quote Anna about the English wind braces against the Dutch ridge pole, “The Dutch people could just as well have said ‘you English keep your hands off our Dutch architecture’, but they didn’t and look how it turned out”. This is just one example of how Anna could take what could be a dry delivery of facts and make it into an interesting story that visitors will remember.

Additional anecdotes from Anna will be included in the next issue of the Delta Mill Society’s newsletter.

Looking ahead to the summer, the Old Stone Mill will be open as usual from the May Long Weekend through to Labour Day, seven days a week, between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Four students will be working as interpreters this season. Plans are ongoing for the creation of new exhibits this year; the most evident will be a small wheat field garden that will be planted on the site of the former Confederated Foods Office building (corner of County Road 42 and Lower Beverley Lake Park Road).



Office and Collections Manager, Rebecca Rothwell, who has a green thumb, will oversee maintaining the field with the support of farmer and miller, Chris Wooding. The heritage Red Fife wheat, that will be milled this summer comes from Chris' farm (Ironwood Organics-photo above) just southeast of Delta. Given that this is a heritage bread wheat, it will quite literally be a living history exhibit.

Another interesting exhibit planned for this season is a display of enhanced and colourized old photos of the mill in the 3rd floor special exhibit space. Glen Russell has kindly completed the work on this project. He has tremendous skills in this field as evident in his Pennock photo exhibit at the Red Brick School House in Elgin last summer.



This c.1930 photo shows the results of enhancement and colourization. Of interest in this photo is the original Denaut Hall (far left) adjacent to the mill. It was built in the 1850s by Walter Denaut. In the 1920s, Hastings Steele sold it to George Snider who converted the lower floor (carriage shed portion) to a blacksmiths shop. In the early 1960s, then owner Gordon Gray, had the brick upper story (the hall) demolished and replaced with the framed top we see today. The DMS bought the building in 1992 and now uses it as a blacksmith shop and for large artefact storage. In 2022, the DMS renovated the blacksmith shop, including rebuilding the main forge and adding a second forge.

The Society will be participating in the new *Summer Solstice* event which will be held on Saturday, June 21st. Megan Carter, a volunteer blacksmith with the Society, is an organizer of this event. Both the blacksmithing and milling demonstrations regularly scheduled for the week prior have been rescheduled to the same day to help with the celebrations. While additional information is unavailable at this time, it is understood that there will be vendors and farmers markets.

On the topic of blacksmithing, please remember that Armstrong and Carter Ironworks of Delta offer heritage blacksmithing courses in the Blacksmith Shop. Information and a link to their site can be found at www.deltamill.org.

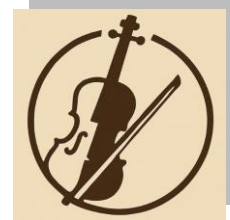

The closing service for Delta Baptist Church, which was originally planned for March 30th, was delayed until April 6th, 2025, due to the ice storm weekend.


Members of the church appreciate the support shown by all who attended the final service and for all the support received from the community throughout the years. Thank you one and all!

The theme of remembering was prominent in the final sermon delivered by Rev. Brian Wheaton. 


Baptist Chapel: built in 1880


Established in 1811 under the leadership of the Rev. Elder Abel Stevens, Sr., a dedicated group of 20 parishioners met to discuss the construction of a much needed Baptist Church. Under Stevens' leadership, the walls and roof were erected but because of financial restraints, the interior remained incomplete. Seeking assistance to complete the building, both Methodist and Anglican congregations worshipped in the church until 1864 when the church was sold to the Anglican Church of Canada for \$1.00 at which time, the church was renamed St. Paul's Anglican.

For the next 15 years, the Baptist Congregation worshipped with their fellow church members in Phillippsville. In 1879, Delta residents decided that they should have their own chapel and so, on a lot which was purchased for \$125 by Nicholas Mattice, a Baptist Chapel was constructed in 1880 with red bricks from the Russell brick yard (now Lower Beverley Lake Park). The church was dedicated on December 19th, 1880 by the Rev. A. Cameron from Ottawa. Additions to the Church were made in 1929 to accommodate a Sunday school room and in 1997 when the Memorial Hall was constructed.


In 1908, the Trustees of the Church purchased a large brick home from parishioners Dan Davison and his wife, Hannah Sexton. This home would serve as the parsonage until 1953 when the Delta and Athens parishes would unite and the minister moved to Athens.

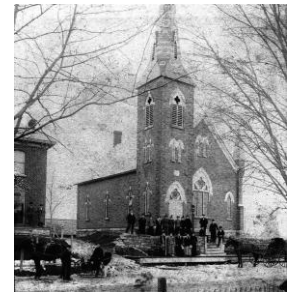
CELEBRATION OF THE UNITED CHURCH OF CANADA 100th ANNIVERSARY SERVICE

On June 10th, 1925, the United Church was inaugurated in Toronto, Ontario, when the Methodist Church of Canada, the Congregational Union of Canada, and 70 percent of The Presbyterian Church in Canada entered a union. Also joining was the small General Council of Union Churches that was centred largely in Western Canada. It was the first union of churches in the world to cross historical denominational lines and receive international acclaim.
