## THANK YOU Message from the Delta Food Bank

Another year has passed and volunteers with the Delta Food Bank have been busy addressing the ever-growing hunger needs in the Delta community. During 2025, there was a 62% increase in the number of clients that were dependent upon the monthly food bank. The volunteers would like to thank everyone for their kindness and generosity in providing both food and funds that filled the shelves for our clients monthly.

The Build a Mountain of Food campaign, which is sponsored by RCL Automotive, 92.3 WOW FM, 88.1 myFM, Your TV Smiths Falls, Hinton Auto Group, Impression Printing and Hometown News, arrived at the Delta Country Market on December 13<sup>th</sup>. The afternoon drive was a great success with over \$7,500.00 and approximately 300 pounds of canned and dry goods being collected for use at the Delta Food Bank. Just a reminder that all donations received stay within Delta to support the Community Food Bank program.

Volunteers were busy with their annual Christmas Hamper campaign. 20 families registered for the program which provided both a full turkey or ham dinner for Christmas and food for a healthy breakfast. The Delta Food Bank received hamper donations from Mensen Family Farm, Willard's Bakery, Delta United Church, and local individuals that provided turkeys, vegetables, and knitted and sewn items. A special vote of thanks goes out to Paul and Linda at the Delta Country Market for preparing and selling bags of food prior to and during the drive.

All individuals and organizations are thanked for their continued support throughout the year as every contribution makes a big difference in the lives of the clients. Thank you one and all for your generosity, care and compassion.

Volunteers with the Delta Mill Society enjoyed a very successful 2025 tourist season as visitors to the Old Stone Mill and to Delta were welcomed from numerous locales including international destinations such as Scotland, France, Brazil, and Germany.

The Fall/Winter newsletter, which is now available online at ([www.deltamill.org](http://www.deltamill.org)), highlights many of the Society's 2025 accomplishments along with focusing on the history of the mill between 1985 and 2004. In 1985, the Delta Mill Society first opened the mill to the public for a full summer season; a program which continues to this date. In 1999, the Society started the heritage restoration of the mill which was completed in early 2004. The details of how the Society managed to carry out and finance the restoration can be found in the newsletter.



The history of the mill is also a significant part of the history of Delta. Receiving the newsletter early (before it's posted to our website) is a perk of membership with the Delta Mill Society; new members are most welcome. The membership and donation forms, which are available on the website, support ongoing efforts to preserve and present the Old Stone Mill, operate the Old Town Hall as a community destination, operate the public washrooms during the tourism season, and showcase the Blacksmith Shop on special occasions.

The website has been updated to include an expanded 'Brief History of Delta' with new photo galleries (photos and videos). New to both pages are colourized heritage photos of the Old Stone Mill and various buildings within Delta. Colour makes the images clearer thus allowing more details to be seen. Those visitors who toured the mill after mid-July would have seen the printed versions in the new 3<sup>rd</sup> floor photo display. These photos, along with many other heritage photos, have been added to the "Visuals" section of the website.



And on the topic of visuals, anyone passing through Delta in the evening from mid-November to early January will see a spectacular view of the Old Stone Mill, the Old Town Hall and the Blacksmith Shop lit up with candles in the windows. This annual tradition was completed through the efforts of DMS director Moel Benoit and volunteers Gus Brown, Grant Ross, and Justin Okum.

And for the second year in a row, “Mini Delta” is out on display in the Russell Greenspace between the Old Town Hall and the Old Stone Mill. The buildings, which are property of the Lower Beverley Lake Park Management Board, were used as part of the park’s Celebrating the Season Christmas program which ended in 2020. The setup is courtesy the Delta Community Enhancement Committee with the Delta Mill Society contributing the power to light up the display.

In early December, I (Ken Watson) braved -16C temperatures to take advantage of a clear day to take some new photos of Christmas lights. The best photos of the lights are taken in a short window of time, just after sunset, with enough light to show the buildings but dark enough to enhance the lights in the windows. I have sets of lights in the mill photos that I took 20 years ago, but with the many changes to Delta since that time, I felt it was time to get some updated photos. A small set of these photos has been posted to the DMS Facebook page and at the time of writing this article, that posting had received over 14,000 views ([www.facebook.com/DeltaMill](http://www.facebook.com/DeltaMill)). Many people are now aware of how beautiful Delta looks during the Christmas season. The lighting of these buildings helps with the vibrance of the Village of Delta.



2025 Summer Interpreters

In preparation for the upcoming summer season, the Society will be hiring four mill interpreters with the job postings being uploaded to the website ([www.deltamill.org](http://www.deltamill.org)) in mid-January. Participating youth must be between the ages of 16 and 30 years (requirements of the granting programs), would like to work locally and gain valuable job experience (everything from heritage presentation to mill shop sales). As part of the team, the interpreters will learn money and inventory management skills along with the historical background of the mill and how to convey that information to the visiting public. The interpreters will become ambassadors for this region as they point out opportunities for all visitors.

### DELTA (Special)

Bastard and Burgess Township School Area Board's centralization program may be speeded up by the fire that gutted the Plum Hollow Public School Monday afternoon. The 16 boys and girls, who were given an unexpected holiday from the 55-year-old "SS No 17", will be temporarily accommodated in the old Daytown School, three miles east of here. Closed four years ago, the 97-year-old stone building will be used until a four-room addition is made to the new Delta school, Beverley Elementary.



The township board which met in inaugural session hours after the fire



razed the old brick school, expects to have plans approved shortly for a second storey addition to the three-room Delta school which opened in 1962. Prepared by architect Selwyn Cooke of Kingston, the drawings will provide accommodation for children in one-room schools in southern Bastard and Burgess Township. Mr. Cooke was in Toronto Tuesday seeking departmental approval. Heading the board's improvement program will be Clarence (Moses) Seed who was elected chairman and his predecessor, Fuller Stevens,

who holds the vice-chairmanship. While looking ahead, the board is still talking about the events of Monday afternoon which saw the loss of the second smallest school in the area without injury to a student. A little more than a year ago, the Forfar School was closed after the roof and walls blew in. Plum Hollow, located on a picturesque bluff beside an abandoned church, went up in flames shortly after class was dismissed at 2:45 p.m. so the teacher, Mrs. Joy Piper of Smiths Falls, could attend a film review meeting at Phillippsville.



Leonard Knapp of R. R. #2 Athens was one of the first to see and report the blaze. The Brockville Fire Department was summoned, and the Athens brigade went to the scene, but the building was a mass of flames. Township School Board Secretary-Treasurer Ronald Morris said the Delta Fire Department, of which he is a member, was not called. He learned of the fire through the insurance man. The fire is believed to have broken out in the stove pipes. Mr. Morris and board members were busy Tuesday arranging for the re-opening of the Daytown School, including trucking of firewood, switching on of hydro power and transportation of the pupils by bus. All books and records were lost, and Mrs. Piper has been seeking new ones. Public school inspector Neil Ellis of Gananoque inspected the blackened wreckage of the Plum Hollow School and the temporary accommodation and delivered a new class register Tuesday. He will attend the board's January 18<sup>th</sup> meeting when the expansion program will be further discussed.

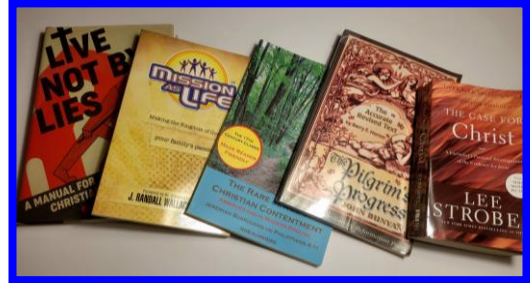

## Enbridge Gas Supports Rideau Lakes Fire & Rescue

Thanks to the combined efforts of Rideau Lakes Fire & Rescue, Enbridge Gas and the Ontario Fire Marshal's Public Fire Safety Council, 156 combined smoke and carbon monoxide alarms were recently donated for distribution within the municipality.

The donation is part of a province wide initiative aimed at reducing fire and carbon monoxide deaths to zero. 14,200 alarms have been donated to 75 communities throughout the province. Enbridge Gas has invested \$450,000 into this year's program and has provided over 115,000 alarms over the past 17 years.

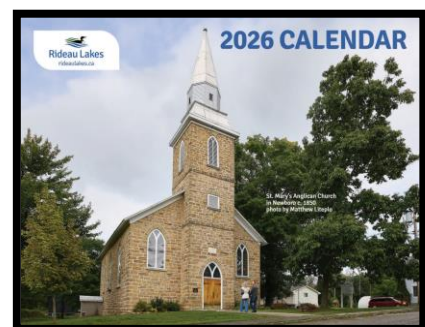

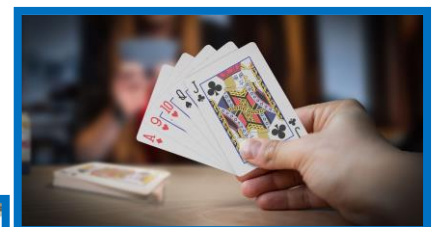

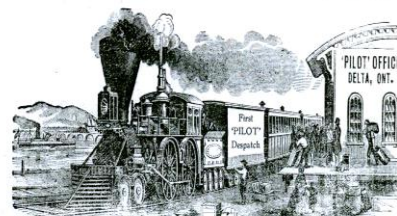

On Thursday April 6<sup>th</sup>, 1905, an article in the **DELTA PILOT** read *"born in the thriving village of Delta, it is a bouncing babe, the idol of the community and has grown so rapidly that it is able to run at an enormous speed"*.

With the Reverend George Wellington Connors as the Editor-In-Chief, the **DELTA PILOT** was distributed every Thursday between 1905 and 1908. The newspaper was printed in a King Street drive shed, which was opposite John Street, on a printing press that had been relocated from a defunct printing plant in Bancroft. The Paper was printed until March 27<sup>th</sup>, 1908.
