Thanks to a partnership between the Seasonal Campers' Recreation Committee and the Park Management Board, a new 24' x 32' open-air pavilion was constructed by Park Staff last fall. Affectionately named "Elbe's Place" after the park mascot, this pavilion will be the new home for all children's activities and events. The campers raised and donated \$32,000 towards this construction project.

## ***Registration Packages for New Seasonal Campers***

Just think... In less than a month, the park will be open, and we will be well on our way to enjoying the summer of 2026!



The park will be open to public occupancy between Friday, May 8<sup>th</sup> and Monday, October 12<sup>th</sup>.

Upon arrival at the park, we request that all **NEW** Seasonal Campers stop at the Gate House to collect their 2026 gate passes. To facilitate the distribution of the passes, Reception Staff will be available prior to the park's opening on the following days:

May 4<sup>th</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

Returning Seasonal Campers may continue to use their existing gate cards to gain access to the park. If you know that you have misplaced your card and will be requiring a new card for the 2026 season, call or email the park now so that a replacement card can be prepared for you.

**MESSAGE from William Morris**  
**Park Manager / Secretary of the Management Board**



Welcome to the summer of 2026! It is hard for me to believe that this year marks my 24<sup>th</sup> season as the Manager of this wonderful park. I am so proud of all the accomplishments and improvements that have been made through the combined efforts of our Seasonal Campers' Recreation Committee Volunteers and our Park Staff. Thank you one and all for making Lower Beverley a much sought after summer destination!

I would like to thank those members of our seasonal camping family who have taken the time to reach out in support of our staff this year. 2026 has started out to be a very tumultuous time, riddled with social media posts, emails and chatter that has negatively impacted our staff and the park itself. Please do not believe all the pessimism that is shared on Facebook. Thank you for your continued support and kindness.

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**Park Improvements Continue**

Since the closure of the park for the season in October, staff have been working on various projects that will improve our facilities once again.

- ✓ The remaining 15-amp sites in the J-Section have now been upgraded to 30-amp service. There are no more 15-amp sites remaining in the park.
- ✓ An additional transformer was installed in the field to enhance electrical services within the J and K sections of the park.
- ✓ "Elbe's Place", the new children's pavilion, has been constructed. There are still a few minor enhancements that will be completed throughout the season.
- ✓ Numerous trees are being removed because of damage from the Emerald Ash Boer.
- ✓ Another new dock has been constructed for placement at the mouth of the creek (Cottage 8).
- ✓ A new zero-turn lawn mower has been purchased for staff use.
- ✓ A new metal nine-hole miniature golf course has been purchased which will replace the former aged wooden structures. Staff are creating new accessories for the course.
- ✓ Aged signage has been replaced at various locations within the park.
- ✓ A new building has been placed across the road from the canteen. "Bear Essentials" is destined to become a storefront location for the sale of park clothing and other camping implements. An official opening date has yet to be determined.

Since the inception of the Management Board, an impressive total of \$2,452,817.00 has been reinvested on capital improvements within the park; all expenses have been paid from park generated revenues and not at the expense of the Rideau Lakes taxpayer



## ***Paula's Pizza Returns!***



Be sure to stop by the Canteen this season for some delicious food and mouthwatering pizza as the Antonakos family returns to Lower Beverley Lake Park. Athena, Spiros, and Paula are anxious to return to the canteen to meet new campers and renew old acquaintances.

Days and hours of operation will vary until the peak camping season, but the food will always be excellent! Feel free to order from the Canteen in advance as take-out orders are available by calling 613-928-0291. Menus will be available at the Canteen and the Gate House.

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## ***Changes in 2026***

Campers are once again impacted by the winds of change and 2026 is no exception with the introduction of additional external regulations which are impacting the operation of the park. Please be mindful of the following:



### ***1. Electrical Inspections***

Each summer, maintenance staff deal with damages to site outlets due to overloaded or damaged cords. Moving forward, cords running from seasonal trailers to the site posts will be periodically inspected by an electrician. Any cords requiring replacement must be changed forthwith.

### ***2. Blue Barrel Inspections***

To ensure that all the blue barrels designated for wastewater on seasonal sites are functioning properly and are intact, they will be periodically inspected. Any damaged tanks will require replacement with an above ground unit at the camper's expense.

### ***3. Docking Restrictions***

Those seasonal campers located along the Delta Creek are no longer permitted to install a dock within the creek.

### ***4. Deck Replacements***

A building permit is required for the construction of any new deck. Seasonal Campers are required to complete a park authorization form to obtain an Ontario Building Code permit from municipal staff.

### ***5. Golf Carts***

While the use of golf carts continues to be restricted to those campers who require their usage for accessibility purposes, campers must now provide proof of liability insurance for the cart. A current accessibility vehicular sticker or a letter from the camper's physician is required. A form has been attached separately from this newsletter for completion and submission.

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## ***Final Installment***



Just a reminder that the final installment for the 2026 camping season will be processed on Friday, May 8<sup>th</sup>.

2027 renewal packages will be available for pick-up at the Gate House on August 1<sup>st</sup>.

## ***Beautification Contest***

The Management Board is pleased to sponsor a Beautification Contest for those patrons occupying seasonal sites.

Judges will be touring the park to view all sites during the week of July 6<sup>th</sup> with the results being posted at the Gate House on July 10<sup>th</sup>. No registration will be required.

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## ***Swimming Lessons in the Park***

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## ***Spring Clean Up***

Just a reminder to all campers who will be in the park cleaning up their lots prior to opening day that any raked leaves need to be placed in a garbage bag and taken to the road for Maintenance Staff to collect. Similarly, garbage should be dealt with in the same manner. We regret that we are no longer able to provide garbage bags for the collection of refuse resulting from yard maintenance work.



**DO NOT BLOW or RAKE LEAVES ACROSS THE ROAD ONTO ANOTHER SITE.**

As outlined in Schedule B to By-Law #2023-08, all proposed outdoor work and / or projects must be pre-approved by Park Management prior to any construction taking place. This includes but is not limited to the adding of soil, cutting, or planting of trees or the spreading of gravel. Anyone wishing to complete such an alteration is asked to submit their request to Gate House Reception Staff for consideration by Management.



## Site Maintenance

Campers are not to dump their grass cuttings, twigs or sticks in the regular garbage cans as they make the bags very difficult to maintain and remove from the cans.



## Septic Pumping Program

Each seasonal camper will once again receive ten pump outs that can be used anytime throughout the season.

Staff will continue to conduct regular septic pumping sessions throughout the camping season to maintain optimal performance and to prevent any issues with trailer systems. As in past years, requests for pump outs must be made through Reception Staff at the Gate House. Staff will maintain a logbook and record the date on which a pump out was used.

The discounted fee for the ten pump outs has already been paid as it was included in the 2026 seasonal site payment. Should campers require more than the allotted number of pump outs, additional pump outs will be available for purchase at the Gate House. Pump outs are not transferable.

Three days have been scheduled for the **collection of liquid waste.**

- ✓ Tuesday (Areas A to F)
- ✓ Wednesday (Areas G to I-13)
- ✓ Thursday (Areas I-14 to 16, J, K, M and all remaining)



**REQUEST YOUR PUMPOUT BEFORE THE DAY OF SERVICE.  
IF YOUR REQUEST IS SUBMITTED AFTER STAFF HAVE COMPLETED PUMPING,  
EMERGENCY PUMPOUT RATES WILL BE CHARGED.**

**Discount programs** for the pumping of liquid waste can be purchased at the Gate House. While single pump out fees are \$25.00 per load, discount packages are available for pump outs for the entire season along with increments of five and twelve.

Pump outs are not transferable and must be used in the current year.

Just a reminder that the **discharging of grey water onto the ground is strictly prohibited.** Grey water is defined as water, with any additions that is disposed of on a regular basis and that originates from showers, laundry, and kitchen/washroom sinks. Campers must ensure that all septic hoses are attached and secure.



## Postal Services

Seasonal Campers need to open a general delivery mailbox at the Delta Post Office if they are using the park's civic address for their mail purposes. Staff cannot accept a camper's personal mail that has been mailed directly to the park at P. O. Box 130, Delta so it will be returned to the sender.

## ***Before You Blow Your Breaker!***



Take a minute and see how many amps you could be using in your trailer. It is surprising to see how fast the amps add up which causes your trailer breaker or the park breaker to trip. By tracking the amps needed for all the electrical appliances in your trailer, you can help manage electrical use and save yourself the inconvenience of saying "My Electricity Went Out!"

Be sure to check the breaker in your own trailer first before calling the Gate House.

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## ***Campfire Wood Sales***

Campfire wood will be available for purchase from Reception Staff at the Gate House. While face cords were available in previous years, campfire wood will only be sold by the ½ face cord this season at a cost of \$65.00.

Staff will continue to deliver the wood to the campsite when time and resources permit.



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## ***Vehicle Parking and Gate Cards***

Campers are reminded that only one vehicle is permitted to be parked on each site. It is important to keep our roadways clear of additional parked vehicles and trailers.

Two proximity vehicle passes are issued to each site holder. Each pass is valid for only one vehicle. Campers who have more than one vehicle and wish to bring the additional vehicle into the park are reminded that they need to park their second vehicle in a designated parking area. Additional vehicle cards, which must be renewed annually, are available from Gate House staff at a cost of \$60.00.



Please remember that giving your gate cards to non-family members to gain access to the park or opening the gates with their cards for members of the public to avoid the purchase of a daily Visitor's Pass from staff is prohibited.

Campers abusing the privilege will have their cards turned off thus requiring a stop at the Gate House each time to gain access to the park.



## Remembering Rules for the Road



The maximum vehicle speed limit in the park is 15 km/hr. Please be mindful of pedestrians and children on bicycles.

This speed limit is also applicable to motorized scooters / carts permitted for handicapped accessibility. Do not abuse this privilege.



Children should wear their helmets while riding their bicycles.



## ATM

For the convenience of our campers and members of the public, an automated teller machine has been installed in the Gate House.

## Propane Tank Exchange Program

We are pleased to once again offer a propane tank exchange. Empty 20-pound tanks may be exchanged for full tanks provided that the tank issuance date is not prior to 2018. Tanks with propane may also be purchased from staff at the Gate House.



## Medical Emergencies

Through a partnership with the Leeds-Grenville Emergency Medical Services and the Ontario Heart and Stroke Foundation, a **defibrillator** unit remains stationed at both the **Gate House and Snack Bar Plus Canteen**. Park staff members have been trained in the operation of these units.



**First Aid Kits** are available at the Gate House, Snack Bar Plus Canteen, Lakersfield Ball Canteen, and the Maintenance Workshop.

If you dial 911, our civic address is **146 Lower Beverley Lake Park Road, Delta**.



With the adoption of the Cannabis Act S.C. 2018, c. 16 on October 17<sup>th</sup>, 2018, campers can anticipate exposure to the smoke fumes in the park at one time or another.

As mandated by **Smoke-Free Ontario Act**, *smoking or vaping tobacco or cannabis is prohibited* in all buildings and structures and within 20 meters of all sport facilities including the playground, the beach, and any sport field.

Whereas campsites are not classified as a permanent place of residence, Seasonal Campers are prohibited from growing cannabis plants on their site.

Should campers have any questions or concerns, please contact the Park Management.

## **No Feeding**

Believe it or not, some of our seasonal geese braved the cold winter temperatures to camp in the park. Many of their families and friends will soon return along with other wildlife. Please DO NOT feed the geese, raccoons, or skunks.

## **If You Need Assistance from Staff.....**

In the event you have any concerns or requests pertaining to your site, please make the request to Gate House Reception Staff. Your request will be recorded in a log and forwarded to the appropriate staff.

We Are Ready to



Staff are **no longer permitted to move a camper's trailer** due to liability restrictions. If a Seasonal Camper is purchasing a new trailer or trading units, it is their responsibility or that of the trailer company to secure a means of removing the trailer from the site. Please accept our apologies for any inconvenience that this change may cause.

## **What is In a Name?**

As part of the in-park beautification program, names were assigned to the roadways within the park. Except for one, all roadways were named after historically prominent people and places within the Delta Community.

| ❖ Jubilee Drive   | Named after Jubilee business block / built in 1897 to honour Queen Victoria's Jubilee.  |
| ❖ Jones Drive     | Named after Will Jones / built the current Stone Mill in 1811.  |
| ❖ Knowlton Drive  | Named after John Knowlton who constructed the United Church.  |
| ❖ LeClaire Drive  | Named after John LeClaire / original owner of Blackjack Island.   |

## ***Dangers Of Carbon Monoxide Poisoning While Camping***

### ***What Is Carbon Monoxide Poisoning?***

Carbon monoxide (CO) is emitted when fuel, such as natural gas or propane, is burned. It is odorless and colorless, virtually impossible to detect. CO reduces the blood stream's ability to hold oxygen. Low levels of oxygen in the body can make you faint and cause the bodily systems to stop functioning properly. In serious cases of carbon monoxide poisoning, the body can shut down completely.



Camping usually involves a tent, camper or RV. When combustibles are used within these enclosed quarters without proper ventilation, people in proximity are at high risk of carbon monoxide poisoning. Lanterns, space heaters, portable grills, gas burning appliances, and other fuel-powered equipment should only be lit and burnt outside.

### ***Symptoms of Carbon Monoxide Poisoning***

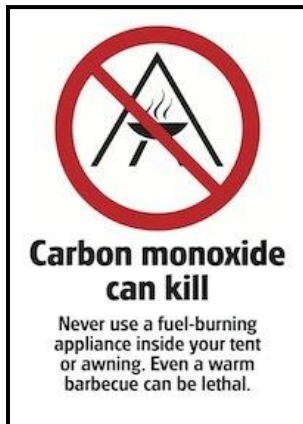
Because the symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning resemble those of the common cold or flu, they are often initially ignored. Immediate attention should be paid to someone who has been exposed to CO emission and displays the following signs and/or complaints:

- headaches
- dizziness
- weakness / excessive sleepiness
- nausea and/or vomiting
- general confusion

### ***Treatment***

The key is to respond quickly. Turn off the appliance and open doors and windows to ventilate the area thoroughly. Call 911 immediately if you suspect that any of the above-mentioned symptoms might be due to an exposure to carbon monoxide.

### ***How to Avoid or Reduce the Risk***



Adequate ventilation in your tent, camper, RV, or any other enclosed area is important. When using gas burning units such as the portable stove in your RV, or gas lanterns in your tent, a conscious effort should be made to keep the door or windows open.

Camping in cold weather is especially dangerous for carbon monoxide poisoning because there is a frequent need for heating units and a strong tendency to stay inside due to the weather.

Enjoy your time camping by being aware of the dangers of carbon monoxide poisoning. Limit the risk to ensure that your family and friends are safe.

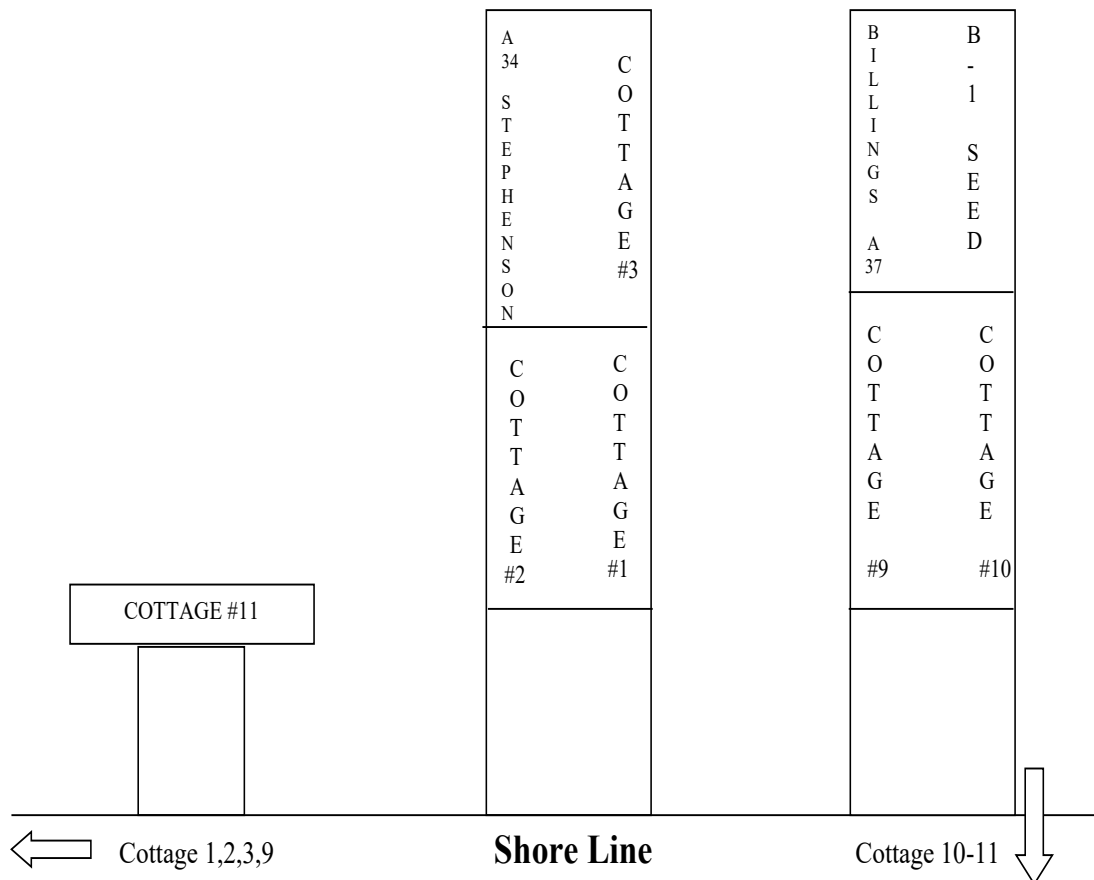
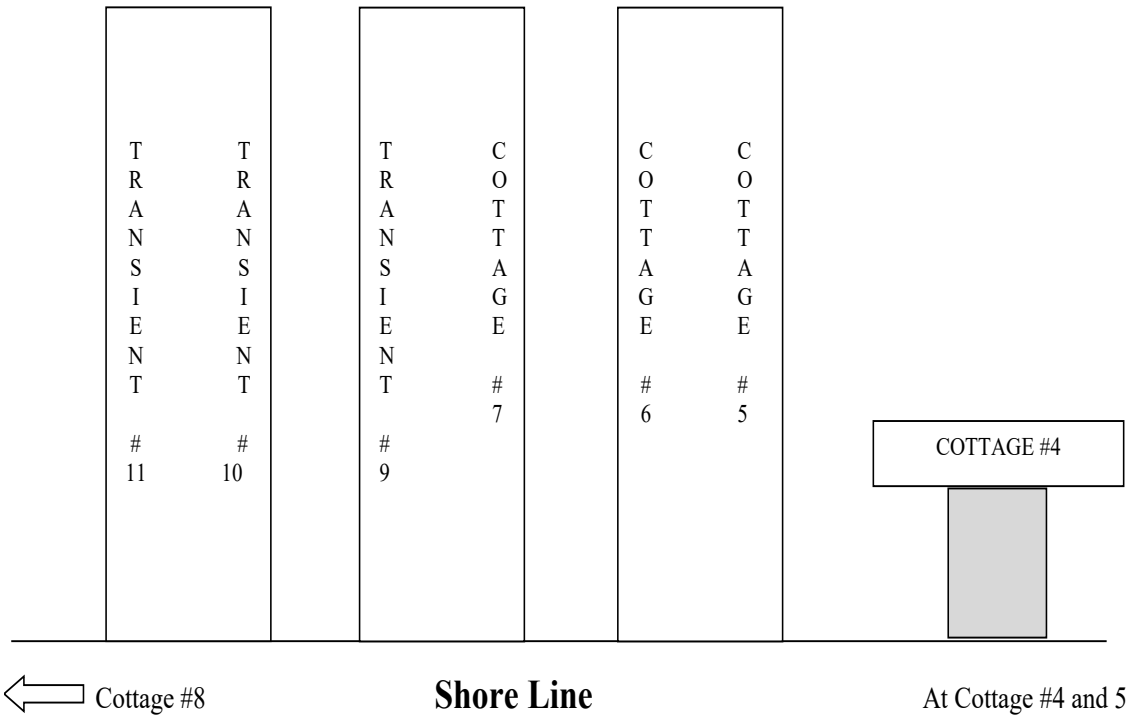

## ***Septic Upgrades Planned***

The Lower Beverley Lake Park Management Board has embarked on yet another project to improve the operation of the 235-campsite ground in Delta. Since the establishment of the Management Board in 2003, an impressive total of \$2,284,051.00 has been reinvested in capital improvements within the park; all expenses have been paid from park generated revenues and not at the expense of the taxpayer.

Following receipt of an engineering report regarding the operation of the septic systems within the park in December 2025, the Management Board has approved the scope of a project that will address the three park systems where replacement leaching beds were recommended. Several of the minor items identified in the report have already been addressed and rectified.

It is important to emphasize that the recommendations for repairs, upgrades, and replacements were made despite the fact that all existing sewage systems remain functional. No system failures have occurred. Staff continue to monitor the operation and maintenance of these systems in accordance with all applicable regulatory requirements to ensure continued safe and reliable performance.

The approved upgrades are targeted improvements to specific systems and are not related to, nor part of, the previous proposal to construct one large, centralized sewage system for the entire campground.

The Management Board remains committed to responsible stewardship of park infrastructure and to ensuring that Lower Beverley Lake Park continues to operate in a safe, compliant, and environmentally responsible manner for the benefit of campers, Rideau Lakes Township and the broader community

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## ***Recycling in the Park***



As many of you are aware, changes to the recycling programs across the province are being implemented since the Ontario government passed regulations that shift the financial and operational responsibility for recycling programs to the producers of recyclable materials.

Recycling programs within the park will remain unchanged. Collection will be provided every Sunday. Seasonal campers must sort, bag and place their recycling next to the garbage barrels before noon on Sunday. Campers are welcome to personally deliver their recycling to the bins in the Maintenance Yard.

**Garbage** is to be placed in clear bags and stored in the closest black and white checkered barrel. Garbage will be collected daily.

Small disposable green **1 lb. propane tanks** should not be included in the site garbage. Please place the tanks beside the black and white checkered waste barrels.

We are no longer able to pick up your large items such as televisions, mattresses, barbeques, trailer furniture, decks etc. In these cases, it is “**carry in / carry out**”. Contact Reception Staff at the Gate House should have any exceptional circumstances.
